Mercy Chose Me ► A full house of 450 people attended the Jan. 23 archdiocesan conference on the Jubilee Year of Mercy at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church in Northglenn CO. Following a celebration of the Eucharist and a continental breakfast, the conference began with a spirited presentation by Augustine Institute's Dr. Ted Szi on the relationship of the Year of Mercy to the New Evangelization and ended with another by Fr. John Ignatius on ways of practicing mercy in the here and now. The centerpiece of the conference, however, was the celebration of **Julia Greeley** as the Archdiocese's Model of Mercy for the Holy Year.

Model of Mercy ► The **Greeley** segment of the day began with the presentation of "**Julia Greeley**—Our Model of Mercy," a 9.25 minute video overview of her life. Prepared by Andrew Wright, the video brought together input by Deacon Clarence McDavid, Mary Leisring, and Fr. Blaine Burkey, interspersed with film of Julia Greeley, portrayed by actress Sonshonae Tull, pulling a mercy-laden red wagon through back alleys and moving about the interior of Sacred Heart Church. Panel of Julia Devotees ► After the video, Chancellor David Uebbing, emcee for the day posed a number of questions about **Julia** to our president Mary Leisring, treasurer Linda Chase, and board member Fr. Blaine Burkey. He asked each how and where they first became aware of **Julia Greeley**, then how each felt the Sacred Heart influenced **Julia**'s spirituality; and which story of her stands out as teaching us how to be emissaries of Mercy. Their answers were not recorded, but perhaps a future *Wagon* may get each of them to re-answer the questions.

A Question of Miracles ► Following Uebbing's questions, someone in the audience asked if there have been any miracles recorded as worked through **Julia**'s intercession. Thinking only of the type of miracle required for a canonization process, Fr. Blaine immediately answered in the negative, but added that there was no need for them until **Julia** might first be judged as having practiced the virtues heroically. Fr. Blaine later wished he had answered differently, since there have been countless people over the past 98 years who have believed that they received various favors through the intercession of **Julia Greeley**, and the Guild strongly desires that anyone who has received such favors show their appreciation for her intercession by informing the Guild in detailed writing of the favors received.

"Angel of Charity," the Image ► Following the panel discussion, Chancellor Uebbing unveiled the sacred image which the archdiocese had commissioned world-known icon writer Vivian Imbruglia to prepare for **Julia**'s installation as Denver's Model of Mercy for the

Wagons. Fr. Scott Bailey, secretary to the archbishop, will be main celebrant and homilist; and The Joyful Noise from Curé d’Ars parish will once again provide musical accompaniment. The Mass will be at Sacred Heart Church, 2760 Larimer Street, Denver, CO at 7:00 p.m. with a reception following, sponsored by the women of Endow.



In Secret Service of the Sacred Heart ► A slightly-revised second printing of our study of **Julia** came off the press just before Christmas. It contains an update on precisely which of Julia’s eyes was destroyed by the slave master and copies of several of Jamian Ajamu Jacobs’ drawing of various episodes of Julia’s life. Each printing has been for 1,000 books.

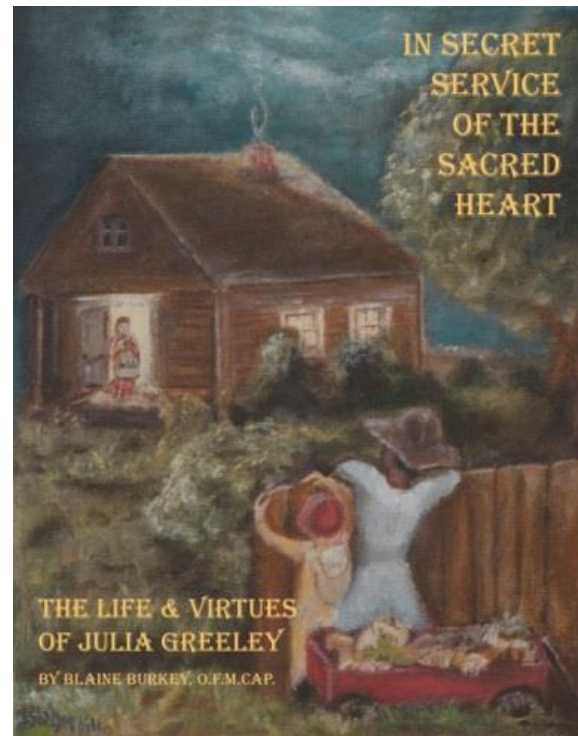

“When I was a small girl I saw **Black Julia** many times in the church praying. She went out on the street with gunny sacks filled with wood, coal, clothes and food and medicine and would make her rounds to the desperately poor for whom no one else provided. She took care of and administered what supplies she could beg for them. Policemen and firemen would give donations to her and recommend her wherever she went because she was taking care of the forgotten poor. She, in turn,

provided them with Sacred Heart badges and medals for those with whom they came in contact. Sister M. Irene doesn’t know where **Black Julia** stayed because people always saw her in the church or on the streets delivering things to the poor.”

Julia Greeley Home ► The Home was opened for single homeless women. The purpose of the home is to take these women “off the street” and prepare them to reenter society productively. Fr. Regis Scanlon, who began the program, put it under the patronage of **Julia Greeley**, because
