# Julia's Annual Death Anniversary Mass •

Auxiliary Bishop Jorge Rodrigues was main celebrant and homilist at the annual guild-sponsored Mass marking the 103<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of Julia Greeley's death.

The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception was appropriately decorated for the event by the strategic placement of five large red wagons, one of which was used to bring the offertory gifts to the altar.

Fr. Ron Cattany cathedral rector and guardian of Julia's remains, Fr. Robert Fisher, and Fr. Blaine Burkey concelebrated, and Deacons Clarence McDavid, Steve

Stemper and David Arling OFS assisted the bishop. About 30 Friends and Members of The Guild, many of them dressed in red, and about another 50 faithful joined to make the event extra-festive.

# **'I'd Love to See That Day'♥**

#### Bishop Jorge Rodriguez's 2021 Homily

As we have been doing for some years, we gather around the Eucharistic table, close to Julia Greeley's remains, placed by the Crucifix and the statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus: her only love. We celebrate the anniversary of Julia Greeley's birth to eternal life.

Official declaration of Julia's sainthood is our hope. We pray for this to happen. The Church waits for the required and verified miracles to happen. We even anticipate the joy for the whole archdiocese of Denver, and especially for our African American Catholic community, of the day when the church will declare solemnly:

"For the honor of the Blessed Trinity, / the exaltation of the Catholic faith and the increase of the Christian life, / by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, / and of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul, / and our own, / after due deliberation and frequent prayer for divine assistance, /and having sought the counsel of many of our brother Bishops, / we declare and define Julia Greeley to be Saint / and we enroll her among the Saints, / decreeing that she is to be venerated as such by the whole Church. / In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

#### I would love to see that day!

But Julia Greeley's sainthood doesn't depend on that day; and her message about sainthood is not for the future, but for today, and for you and me. Cardinal Semeraro, Prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, said in an interview last month that "The saints don't need our recognition, the proclamation of saints is useful on earth, not for Heaven, but when we appreciate them as such, we recognize the presence of God among us and, what can be more beautiful and comforting for a Christian than to feel the warmth of the closeness of the Lord?"

Our sister Julia, one of us in our Church in Denver, was the loving presence of God among us, a beautiful expression of God's love, especially for the poor, and a warm reflection of God's holiness: without

sophistication or grandiosity, but simple, real and genuine.

On this occasion we are celebrating the votive Mass of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, because we know how great her love for Jesus was, and how heartfelt her devotion to His heart was. This love explains Julia's holy life. This love is what makes Saints: the gracious love of Jesus in us, and our openness to this love.



I wonder what the connection between Julia's life and heart was to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. There was something in the Sacred Heart that touched Julia's heart and

dragged her to Jesus' love.

In life, Julia knew slavery and had to navigate through discrimination and segregation. She surely experienced and was aware of the sufferings of black people during the time she lived.

I don't know if she ever had to sit only in the back of the church. Such experiences hurt deeply people's dignity deeply and upset all their emotional life. In life, Julia knew only serving people and making other people's life more comfortable. She had to obey other people's will all the time, and do things as commanded. And a life of poverty, probably loneliness. I cannot imagine the impact of Jesus's words on the heart of Julia at the end of the day: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:28-30). And the statue of Jesus showing to her his heart and stretching out his arms towards her, was the most moving expression of God loving her as a daughter, despite her humble origin and social

condition, being born into slavery. a help. Jesus, personally looking at her and inviting

her to his love meant the world to her. Only Jesus in the heart of this holy woman, can explain how slavery, discrimination,



segregation, poverty and social margination didn't touch her heart; instead, keeping her heart loving, forgiving, generous and humble. Julia, that woman dragging a red wagon, or handing out medals of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, walking among the indifference of some, looked down by others, or attracting some sympathy looks, was--in the words of Card. Semeraro--"the presence of God among us and, beautiful and comforting warmth of the closeness of the Lord." And this happened and was real, before any declaration of Julia Greeley as Servant of God, or Blessed or Saint. In Julia we see the power of Love. The love of Jesus makes saints. The love of Julia for Jesus helps us to be saints. For sure Julia knew about the words of Jesus when he appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque: "Behold the Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming Itself, in order to testify Its love; and in return, I receive from the greater part

only ingratitude" The suffering heart of Jesus spoke loudly to the suffering heart of Julia. Julia identified with the suffering and loving Jesus. I don't know how longer we will wait to hear the



solemn proclamation of Julia's canonization, but today Julia Greeley tells us that holiness is real, that holiness is among us, that holiness is always present, that God's love makes saints.... And with her life, she reminds us that each one of us is called to be a saint. Those saints walking in our streets, sitting on our pews bringing the love of Jesus in their hearts and been His hands to take care of the poor. Are we able to recognize God's love in us and in others? Are we able to recognize the saints among us today? If the answer was "yes", then, we would have been able to recognize something special, something divine, in that black woman handing out little medals, or dragging a red wagon by the streets of Denver!

#### An Old Black Woman & \$5 🕈

For members of one family, Julia Greeley is always by their side. In January, 2020, Ann, a devoted grandmother, was praying outside a hospital where her newborn grandson, Tommy, was undergoing delicate, lifesaving surgery. Months before, she had learned about Julia Greeley's cause for sainthood and decided she would place her grandson in Julia's care.

While they waited, Ann and her husband Paul were walking around the hospital grounds. Suddenly, coming toward them was an old black woman walking with a cane. Her eyes were glassy, and it was obvious she could not see well. The old woman asked the worried grandparents if they had five dollars so that she could take the bus home. As Ann recalled, "We gave her money and she looked right into my eyes and said, "God bless you."

At that very moment, their daughter called from inside the hospital to say that Tommy's surgery had just ended successfully, and he was doing fine!

Once back in the neonatal unit, Tommy was in good care, too. The name of his first nurse? Julia.



### Car Found in Julia's Canoe ♥

On Jan. 31, 2019, Kenzie H. placed a request in Julia's Canoe:

"Hi, I am a missionary and I do not have a car, nor do I have the financial means to get one. About three months after I sent in this intention, someone donated me a used car! Praise Jesus and thank you so much for your prayers, Julia, pray for us!"


