Big News from Rome! Apostolic Phase of the Julia's Cause Moves Forward

To the oft-asked question of the past three years, "How is Julia's cause coming?," we can now answer, "It's going well, thanks be to God."

Archbishop Samuel Aquila and Vice Postulator Dave Uebbing signed papers on Nov. 12, 2021, hiring Dr. Cristiana Marinelli, a 49-year-old Roman woman, to draft the Positio super Vita, Virtutibus et Fama Sanctitatis (A Position on the Life, Virtues and Fame of Sanctity) which, using the testimony gathered in the archdiocesan phase held in Denver 2017-2018, will summarize the case for saying that Julia

practiced the virtues to a heroic degree and is well known for her sanctity,

This will be done under the supervision of the Postulator, Dr. Waldery Hilgeman, and the Relator appointed by the



Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

Once the position has been prepared, commissions of historians, theologians and bishops will discuss its contents and hopefully agree that Julia should be named a venerable.

Dr. Marinelli has previously worked on such petitions for the Causes of 17 other Servants of God, including three Americans: Fr. Emil Kapaun (d. 1951), Fr. Augustus Tolton (d. 1897), and Sr. Blandina Segale (d. 1941).

Her work with Fr. Tolton is of particular interest to the Guild, since he has already been named a Venerable and shares important life experiences with Julia.

Julia Greeley, Super Hero V extracted from a larger Donor Profile in the January

Bob Gallegos had never heard of Julia Greeley, but he knew Fr. Regis Scanlon. Their friendship had been deepening since the 1980s when Bob joined Father's popular group, the Auraria Catholic Club.

By 2010, Bob was among the close friends who watched the irrepressible priest escape a close call with death, then announce he was

founding a safe haven for homeless women in desperate circumstances. "He told me he thought the Lord had spared his life so he could help women who had no place to go, and he wanted to name the home after Julia Greeley...."

"I had never heard of Julia before, but immediately fell in love with her," says Bob, a street supervisor for Denver's regional transportation district. "It was the way Father described her life. He said she was so humble, she would collect clothes and things to deliver to people, but she would do it at night so people wouldn't be seen with her. Something about her life hit me and touched me.

In fact, Bob believes that Julia's life as a former slave, a black woman who lived quietly but heroically in the 19th and early 20th centuries, is more compelling than any of the manufactured heroes of today.

"We have all these fictional characters and Marvel 'super heroes'," says Bob, "and yet the saints are a thousand times more interesting than 'Captain America' and 'Spider Man'. Julia Greeley—now there's a super hero!"


