Denver Sanctity Revisited ♥


In several previous issues, we have given a growing list of Servants of God who have spent time in the Denver metropolis. There were nine such people listed in Issue 21, one of them already a Venerable, and five Saints.

To these we can now add Servant of God Michelle Christine Duppong, who we've just learned was born in Wheat Ridge CO on Jan. 25, 1984. She was baptized at St. Joan of Arc Church in Arvada CO on Feb. 5, 1984, and lived with her parents, Ken and Mary Ann Duppong at 5834 Oak St. in Arvada for the first year of her life. The Duppongs then moved to Haymarsh ND.

Michelle returned several times to the Denver area during her 2006-2012 service as a missionary with the Fellowship of Catholic University Students to attend retreats at Camp St. Malo and Mother Cabrini Shrine. She died of cancer on Christmas Day, 2015, and Bishop David Kagan of Bismarck opened her cause on June 15, 2022. FOCUS plans to unveil a documentry on Michelle later this year.



Julia in Kansas City♥

The Guild recently received word from nine senior girls at St. Teresa's Academy in Kansas City MO, telling of their class projects on Julia Greeley, aimed at letting the rest of their school know about Julia through "making a video that will be played on the school news, distributing prayer cards, and decorating a bulletin board.

The Academy is a ministry of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet (based in St. Louis), the religious community of Guild board member, Sr. Marion Weinzapfel, C.S.J.

One of the girls sent the Guild the following beautiful email:

"Hello! My name is Gabriella Bailey and I am a senior at St. Teresa's Academy located in Kansas City, Missouri. I am working on a group project in my religion class about black women who are up for the process of canonization. My group's assigned woman was Julia Greeley.

"We are so inspired by the life she lived and how she remained positive through all the hardships she had been through. At such a young age she faced things most people won't have to in their whole life.

"Although she was freed from slavery through the Emancipation Act, she still was a servant and could have chosen to live a miserable life; however, she didn't.

"Learning about her, we have learned that she respected the dear neighbor without distinction. Her values align directly with those of our school values. We wanted to reach out and thank you for all the work you are doing to help this incredible woman obtain sainthood and we are so grateful to be able to educate ourselves on her with the help of your website.

"We look forward to living out her mission and sharing what we have learned about her with the rest of our school. Thank you so much! Gabriella Bailey"

Mar. 27, they found the students already acquainted with Julia and ready to ask a lot of questions.

The school also had its own surprise presentation for them. They were introduced to Julia MarieCaldwell, daughter of Kristen and Nick Caldwell. After Kristen had suffered multiple miscarriages, the schoool's assistant principal, Sister Marilú Abesú, suggested she ask Julia Greeley to intercede for a safe delivery of another child. Kristen, her family and friends prayed for Julia's

intercession throughout the next pregnancy, and baby Julia Marie was born Feb. 10, 2023.

An interesting sidebar to the story is the fact that Caldwell was the family name of Julia Greeley's slave "owner" at Caldwell MO (now Woodland MO) in the mid-19th century.

Regis High Diversity Day ♥

Mary and Essy Goffinett also spoke about Julia with two different groups at Regis High School's Diversity Day on Feb. 14. It was their second year there.

While praying our prayer for Julia's intercession, the students asked her to interceed for school safety as well as for their families. Some of the students stayed after school to ask more questions.

2023 Bus Pilgrimage♥

With the help of a 56-passenger Colorado Coach Line bus, 56 happy devotees of Julia Greeley wended their way on Saturday, Mar. 18, past some 19 sites known to have been visited by the Servant of God.

They were on the Capuchins' Brown Robe Benefit 2023 Lenten Pilgrimage led by Fr. Blaine Burkey, O.F.M.Cap. Numerous Guild members and friends were aboard



along with many more benefactors of the friars.

They included visitors from Illinois, Kentucky and various parts of Colorado.

Seats on the bus sold for \$100, which helped pay for the bus and its driver, Alex Hopper; a tasty box lunch from Capriotti Subs; and training programs for some 17 young Capuchins presently in formation.

Longer portions of the pilgrimage were spent in the PlanOmatic Office at 2911 Walnut St., where Julia lived for 13 years, when it was once a boarding house; at Sacred Heart Church, her long-time parish



center; and at the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception, where she is the only person buried.

At Sacred Heart Church, they also got to see the recently rediscovered painting of the Sacred Heart which Julia had viewed daily from 1880 till a fire damaged it in 1911. (See an article on the painting in Issue 38)

Decree of Validity ♥


